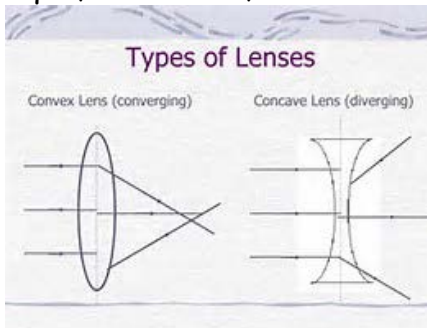

- MATH- daily grade 4/21 measuring angles using a protractor.

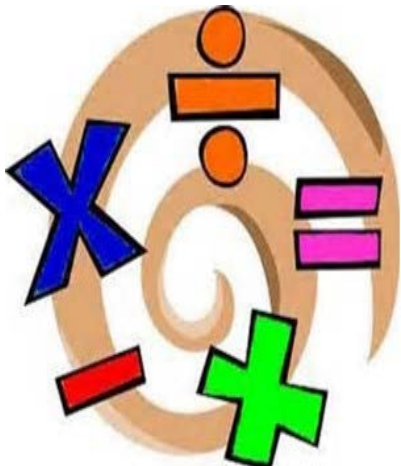
Science

Math

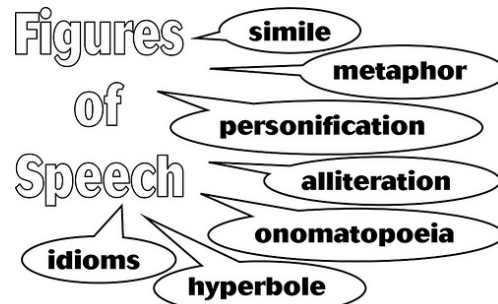
Students will review drawing and measuring angles using a protractor.
